

In November 2022, Michigan voters overwhelmingly approved a constitutional amendment that gives voters the right to vote early and in person at early voting sites before statewide and federal elections.

Early voting will be available beginning with the February 27, 2024 Presidential Primary and every statewide and federal election thereafter.

Early voting allows a voter to cast a ballot before Election Day by inserting their ballot directly into a tabulator, in an experience similar to voting on Election Day.

The early voting period takes place for a minimum of nine consecutive days, ending on the Sunday before an election.

Early Voting does not impact Election Day procedures. Election Day Voting will remain at each jurisdiction's formerly assigned precincts.
